The Career Personality Profiler measures six broad interest areas:



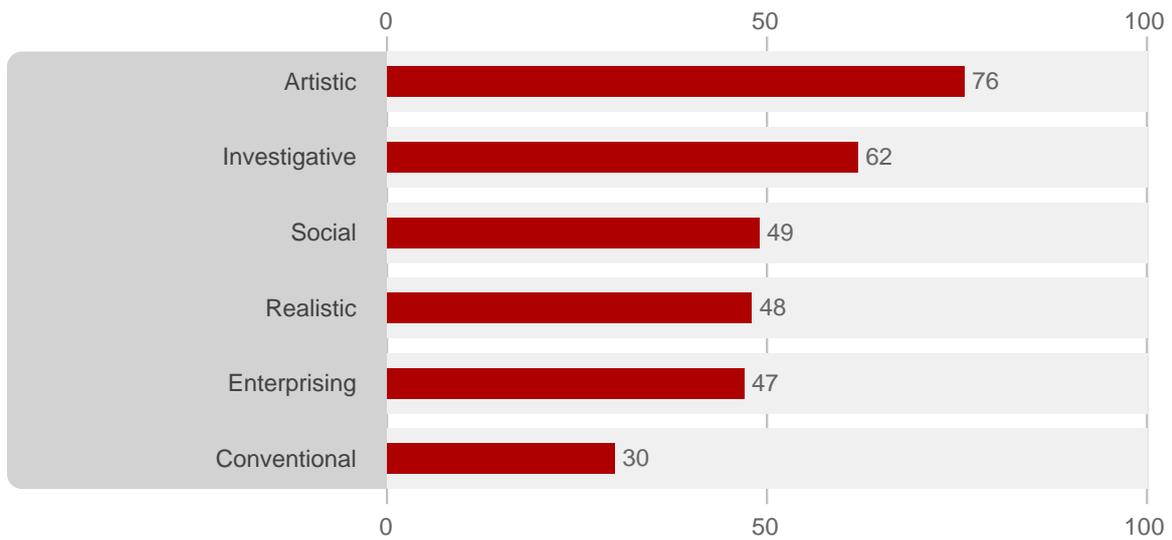

Like people, environments or occupations may not be best represented by one Interest Area. They also may be represented better by several areas. Because of this heterogeneity in the interests of people and occupations, several Interest Areas usually serve as the most appropriate representation of an individual's interests, as well as the interests that a work environment (or an occupation) satisfies. Thus, Career Personality Profiler uses both primary and secondary Interest Areas to explore occupations.

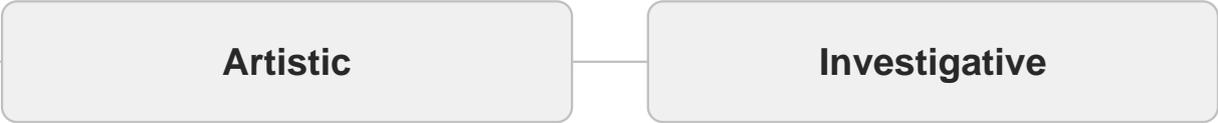

Investigative

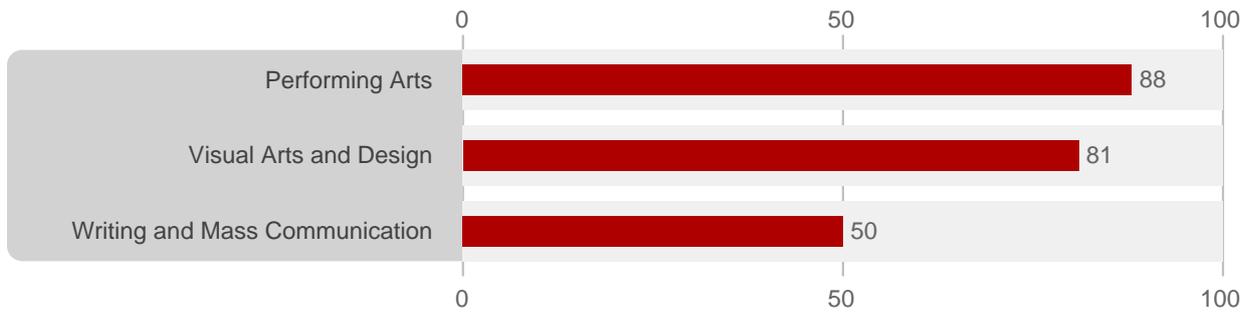

Some typical jobs that Investigative people enjoy include: Computer System Analyst, Economist, Environmental Scientist, Forensic Science Technician, Geologist, etc.

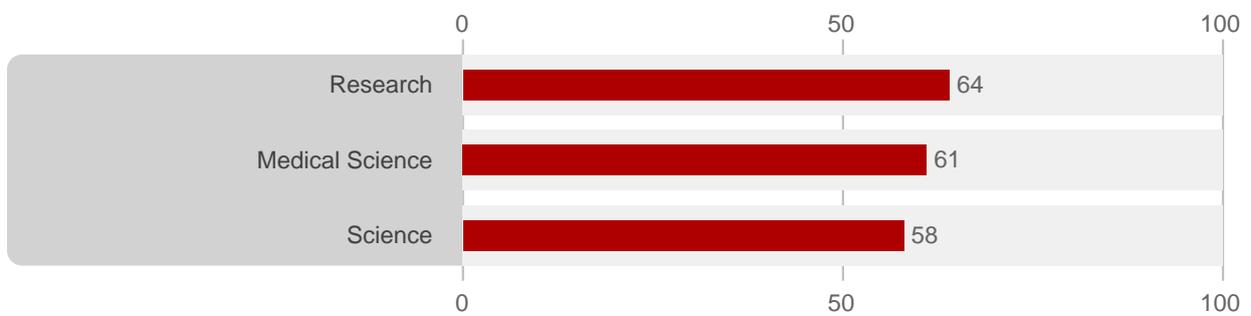
